2b. GBC – PROGRAM <u>FOR POSSIBLE ACTION</u> ELIMINATION, AAS IN INDUSTRIAL ENERGY EFFICIENCY

GBC requests approval to eliminate its AAS in Industrial Energy Efficiency due to low enrollment in the program. There are no students in the program. (*Ref. ASA-2b*)

2c. UNLV – PROGRAM ELIMINATIONS, BS, MS and PHD IN INFORMATICS

FOR POSSIBLE ACTION

UNLV requests approval to eliminate its BS, MS and PHD in Informatics due to budget constraints. Students may pursue related degrees in the School of Computer Science. (*Ref. ASA-2c*)

2d. UNLV – PROGRAM ELIMINATION, BAED IN WORKFORCE EDUCATION

FOR POSSIBLE ACTION

UNLV requests approval to eliminate its BAED in Workforce Education due to low enrollment in the program. Students currently enrolled in the program will be accommodated through graduation. (*Ref. ASA-2d*)

2e. UNLV – ORGANIZATIONAL <u>FOR POSSIBLE ACTION</u> UNIT ELIMINATION, INSTITUTE FOR SECURITY STUDIES

UNLV requests approval to eliminate the Institute for Security Studies. The federal and local grants used to fund the Institute are no longer available. (*Ref. ASA-2e*)

2f. UNLV – ORGANIZATIONAL <u>FOR POSSIBLE ACTION</u> UNIT ELIMINATION, DEPARTMENT OF WOMEN'S STUDIES

UNLV requests approval to eliminate the Department of Women's Studies due to a low number of majors. Students currently enrolled can take courses in the Interdisciplinary Degree Programs where the Women's Studies degree is offered. (*Ref. ASA-2f*)

2g. NSC – PROGRAM ELIMINATION, BS IN OCCUPATIONAL SCIENCE

FOR POSSIBLE ACTION

NSC requests approval to eliminate its BS in Occupational Science due to the termination of its agreement with Touro University and insufficient resources to hire additional faculty to support upper division coursework. Students currently enrolled will be accommodated through graduation. (*Ref. ASA-2g*)

2h. UNR – PROGRAM DEACTIVATION, BFA IN THEATRE

FOR POSSIBLE ACTION

UNR requests approval to deactivate its BFA in Theatre. Students currently enrolled will be accommodated through graduation. Deactivated programs are considered formally eliminated after five years unless the institution otherwise notifies the Board of its reactivation. (*Ref. ASA-2h*)

Specifically, the proposal would eliminate the provision authorizing institutions to offer remedial and 100-level courses on a high school campus at a reduced fee and revise the provision concerning reduced fees for distance education courses to expand to all distance learning courses (not college-level only) and increase the fee from \$25 to \$50 per course, effective Fall 2012.
