A. Reason for proposed elimination of the program

We are streamlining our Master's degrees to offer only an M.Ed. (with thesis or non-thesis options), as opposed to both an M.Ed. and an MA option. In the past, the MA was the thesis option and the M.Ed. was the non-thesis option. We would like to simplify our program by offering just an M.Ed. with either a thesis or non-thesis option.

B. Specify plan to phase out the program, including description of how the needs of currently enrolled students will be met

All requirements for MA students can be met through the course offerings of the M.Ed. degree. We aren't actually offering fewer courses; we are just streamlining the type of degree our students can earn. All current students will be allowed and able to finish under the new program, but we will no longer accept applicants for the MA degree.
