2. BACKGROUND & POLICY CONTEXT OF ISSUE:

The Southern Nevada Writing Project (SNWP) is located at UNLV and directed by Professor Marilyn McKinney from the College of Education's Teaching and Learning Department.

As one of nearly 200 writing projects sites in the National Writing Project (NWP) network, SNWP is a research-based professional development model aimed at improving the teaching of writing and learning; it serves as a "professional home" for over 100 NWP trained teacher-consultants. Beginning in 1984, SNWP is one of the longest standing programs at UNLV. With a tagline of "Changing Teachers Lives", SNWP is dedicated to providing teachers with a professional community and resources to effect and improve teaching throughout their careers.

3. SPECIFIC ACTIONS BEING RECOMMENDED OR REQUESTED:

UNLV President Len Jessup will introduce Kim Metcalf, Dean, College of Education, and Mr. Ian Salzman, SNWP participant and 2015 Teacher of the Year, to present for information about SNWP, a collaborative program with the Clark County School District and one of the longest standing programs at UNLV.

4. IMPETUS (WHY NOW?):

Per the request of Vice Chairman Wixom, who met Mr, Salzman at a conference and requested President Jessup share information about this program with the Board, Dean Metcalf will update the Board on the success and impact of SNWP, both locally and nationally.

5. BULLET POINTS TO SUPPORT REQUEST/RECOMMENDATION:

- SNWP is one of the longest running programs at UNLV serving educators and youth throughout southern Nevada.
- SNWP has impacted over 1,200 teachers who have in turn affected several thousand students throughout the 31 years on the UNLV campus.
- At a time when the teacher shortage is of utmost concern in Nevada, SNWP is one of the many ways the College of Education is addressing this and other important education issues in Nevada.


