Student Profile


- 11,600 students each semester
 - state-supported classes
- 5 sites in Reno
 - 16 % of TMCC students are enrolled online only
- Median age of 23
- Majority attend part time (< 6 credits)
- 1,200 degrees/certificates conferred each year
- 18% enrolled on-line only (fall 2014)



Enrollment by Age



#2 The ratio of administrative vs. instructional spending over the last 10 years: Has the growth of administrative spending exceeded that of instructional spending? Why?




Since 2005, the ratio of administrative spending to instructional spending has decreased from 39% to 33%, reflecting the College's commitment to minimize reductions in the classrooms during the periods of budget decline.




#3 What is Our Building Utilization?

What is Our Building Utilization, Monday - Saturday?




Peak use for classrooms and labs is from 9-2 pm and again from 6-8 pm. 18% of our FTE is now online.

More robust scheduling systems are in place to maximize classroom and lab capacities, particularly during off peak hours.





#4 What are the Salaries of Top Administrators?






Instructional Workload of TMCC Faculty, Fall 2014









TMCC Student Performance on Nationally-Normed Tests






Pass Rates Trends Last 10 Years



#7 CCSSE Benchmarks of Effective Educational Practice

- Benchmark scores are standardized to have a mean of 50 and a standard deviation of 25 across all respondents
- TMCC is below top-performing colleges in every benchmark
- TMCC is above the 2013 CCSSE comparison cohort in Student Effort and Academic Challenge benchmarks



*Top-Performing colleges are those that scored in the top 10 percent of the cohort by benchmark.




#8 What is the Three-Year Graduation Rate for First-Time, Full-Time students?

#9 When was the Most Recent Campus Climate Survey Results on Academic Freedom and Intellectual Diversity?

 NFA TMCC Campus Climate Survey completed in May 2015

- Administered to full-time instructional and administrative faculty (298)
- Detailed analysis to be conducted with strategies to address areas where improvement is needed



#10 How do we Choose for Ourselves Board Professional Development and Independent Sources of Information on National Trends?

TMCC uses the following national comparison frameworks:

- Annual IPEDS Data Feedback Report
 - IPEDS Integrated Postsecondary Data System, primary source of data on colleges, universities, technical and vocational postsecondary institutions in the U.S.
 - Nationally published data comparing TMCC to peer institutions
- National Community College Benchmarking (NCCBP)
 - TMCC participates along with 261 community colleges across the nation
 - Provides overview of TMCC's strengths and opportunities for improvement in comparison to other institution



Final Thoughts

- Beginning in FY2009, TMCC has seen a reduction in state operating funds totaling 34% (\$14.8 Million)
- Student enrollment has declined 9% from FY09 6,796 to FY14 6,166
- However, TMCC's graduation rate has increased from13% in 2009 to 28% in 2014
