




CSN Enrollment Trends 2005-2014

CSN Online Enrollment








2. The ratio of administrators vs. instructional spending over the last 10 years:

Ratio of administrative vs. instructional spending over the last 10 years








Room Utilization for Charleston Campus Fall 2014


4. What are the salaries of top administrators and athletic department personnel?






6. How do students perform on licensure exams required by NV employers?

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

CSN Licensure Pass Rates – 5-Year Average







CCSSE Benchmarks of Effective Educational Practice (Sp 2011)


CSN Compared to Ex-Large Colleges (>15,000 Students)

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

IPEDS Completions 2009-10 through 2013-14 Academic Years




The American Association of Community Colleges created the Voluntary Framework of Accountability (VFA) as the first national system of accountability specifically for community colleges and by community colleges

Campus Climate Surveys



- Every three years the Personal Assessment of the College Environment (PACE) survey is administered
- Annual CSN Campus Climate Survey "Snapshot"
 - Institutionally-developed instrument
 - Targeted focus on trending elements of campus climate
 - Administered to <u>all</u> employees
- CSN has been assessing campus climate at regular intervals since 2010

2012 PACE Survey Top Mean Scores Items Related to Climate

Ratings on a scale of 1 to 5 with 5 being the highest.

- IPEDS Data Feedback Report
 - Annual report that provides CSN with summary of reported data and comparisons to peer institutions
- IPEDS Data Center
 - Allows CSN to build comparisons to other institutions using historical IPEDS data

- Voluntary Framework of Accountability (VFA)
 - Provides community college-appropriate measures to determine how well we are serving students
 - Provides benchmarking reports, data and online tools to compare to IPEDS and other VFA schools
- Achieving the Dream (ATD)
 - Provides a network of support and best practices to enhance student success
 - Provides online tools and data to compare CSN to other schools within the ATD network

- Community College Survey of Student Engagement (CCSSE)
 - Assessment of community and technical college student experiences
 - Provides benchmarking data amongst 300+ American community colleges
- Noel-Levitz Student Satisfaction Inventory (SSI)
 - Measures student satisfaction and priorities and the issues important to them
 - Identifies strengths and challenges; comparisons to national scores

• Perkins Performance Accountability

- Administered by NV Department of Education, Career and Technical Education (CTE) as required under the Perkins IV regulations
- NV CTE students are measured against Performance Indicators developed by State and US Department of Education

- Accessibility, electrical, exterior structure, fire/life safety, HVAC, interior finishes, plumbing, and parking.
