## PART 1

## A. Action requested

In January 2015, Dr. Mridul Gautam, Vice President for Research & Innovation requested approval from the president and provost to establish a new unit: the Office of Enterprise & Innovation. This office was to be the umbrella office comprised of the Office of Enterprise and Commercialization, the Innevation Center Powered by Switch (IC), the Nevada Center for Applied Research (NCAR), and Nevada Industry Excellence (NVIE). The purpose of the Office of Enterprise & Innovation is to assemble these university offices engaged in entrepreneurial activity under one entity so as to create synergies and foment an entrepreneurial ecosystem within the University and the surrounding region. In addition to requesting that OEI be formally recognized, the university requests that the name of the office responsible for commercialization be officially named the Office of Enterprise & Commercialization.

## B. Brief description and purpose of proposed unit

The Office of Enterprise & Innovation is composed of four components: Technology licensing, Nevada Center for Applied Research, the Innevation Center Powered by Switch, and Nevada Industry Excellence. The common theme is commercialization. This includes commercialization of university-created intellectual property, supporting industry through use of UNR shared research resources, and creating an ideation and makers space where students, faculty, and community members can obtain business mentoring and perform research and development activities. The goal is to create an entrepreneurial ecosystem with an eye toward fulfilling the economic development aspect of UNR's mission.

## C. Outline plans for the success of the proposed unit

The unit has diverse functions which require diverse approaches to building the entrepreneurial ecosystem in a cogent and successful manner. Each subunit has its own metrics for assessing activities. For example, Enterprise & Commercialization measures the number of invention disclosures received from faculty, the number of license agreements, and the total annual royalty revenues, among other measures. NVIE's success is measured through their impact on the

companies with whom they work. NCAR tracks the number of engagements with the private sector as well as the dollars brought into the university from its activities. The Innevaton Center quantifies facilities rentals, memberships sold and maintained, use of the makers space, et cetera. Enterprise & Innovation deals with a number of constituencies including faculty, government officials, private sector companies of all sorts, individuals from the community, students, investment companies, and more. As the commercialization entry point for UNR, it is important that E&I function as much like a business as possible while protecting the interests of the university. E&I's processes need to be simple and fast and we need to assist our clients in ways that make sense in the business world. In addition to the metrics mentioned here, the office constantly seeks user feedback on how it is doing so as to modify procedures to make it easy for business to work with the unit as well as with the entire university. In so doing, E&I is fulfilling part of the land grant mission of service and economic development.

The Office of Enterprise & Innovation facilitates the creation of an entrepreneurial ecosystem at the University. E&I is a service-oriented organization striving to:

- Protect intellectual property, support licensing, provide business mentoring, and enable commercialization of the innovations produced via the research activities of faculty and students
- Create partnerships with companies that will develop research discoveries into products for the public benefit
- Promote regional economic development through strategic partnerships with the University and the private sector


