## 1. AGENDA ITEM TITLE: Handbook and Procedures \& Guidelines Manual Revisions, Student Fees

 MEETING DATE: December 1-2, 2016
## 2. BACKGROUND \& POLICY CONTEXT OF ISSUE:

P\&G Chapter 7, Section 11 (Student Fees) and Section 12 (Special Course Fees) - The Board of Regents approves Registration Fees and Tuition, Student Fees and Special Course Fees per Board policy. The Board of Regents Handbook at Title 4, Chapter 17, Section 21, sets the conditions under which student fees may be assessed. The language of this section of the Handbook also requires that mandatory fees shall be reviewed and approved by the Board of Regents.

Similarly, the Board of Regents Handbook at Title 4, Chapter 17, Section 22, sets the conditions under which Special Course Fees may be assessed. This section of the Handbook requires Board approval for all Special Course Fees greater than $\$ 50.00$ per course and specifies the activities to which these fees apply.

Each of the proposed changes in Student Fees and in Special Course Fees has been thoroughly considered at the campus level. In the process of considering changes to the fee structures, students at each of the campuses and at undergraduate and graduate levels as appropriate, have been involved in the fee committee deliberations.

As in prior years, Attachment A contains an Executive Summary of the proposed changes in Student Fees. The current full list of the Board approved Student Fees, including proposed changes is also attached (Attachment B).

The proposed changes in Student Fees that have been submitted by the campuses are also presented in a format that includes information about the number of students affected by the proposed changes as well as information about the proposed changes in revenues associated with the proposed fee changes. The attached spreadsheets contain this information regarding proposed changes in Student Fees, proposed changes in Special Course Fees, and proposed changes in Residence Hall and Food Service Rates (Attachment C).

All fees proposed in the request will be effective the Fall of 2017 semester except the following:

- UNLV: DPT 750, Prosthetics \& Orthotics - Requesting effective date of Spring 2017.

Vice Chancellor for Finance Vic Redding requests approval of proposed Procedures and Guidelines Manual revisions addressing special fee and student fee changes for NSHE institutions. These fees include changes to special course fees, residence hall rates at UNR and individual student fees.

## EXECUTIVE SUMMARY OF STUDENT FEES

The following is a list of proposed changes:

## Student Fees

## UNLV

- Increase Student Association Fee - Graduate from $\$ 5.00 /$ credit to $\$ 5.50 /$ credit in FY 18 , $\$ 6.00$ /credit in FY19, $\$ 6.50$ in FY20 and $\$ 7.00$ /credit in FY21.
- Increase Student Support Activities Fee (Athletics Fee) - Undergraduate from $\$ 1.00 /$ credit to $\$ 1.50$ in FY18, $\$ 2.00$ in FY19, $\$ 2.50$ in FY20 and $\$ 3.00$ in FY21.
- Increase Student Life Facilities Fee from $\$ 173.00 /$ semester to $\$ 198.00 /$ semester in FY18 and $\$ 223.00 /$ semester in FY19. The $\$ 173.00 /$ semester fee was implemented Fall 2006 with no increase since the facilities opened in 2007.
- Increase Technology Fee - Regular from $\$ 4.00$ to $\$ 8.00 /$ credit. The current fee has not changed since it was initiated in 2000.
- New Fee - EMHA Program Fee: This $\$ 150.00 /$ credit fee will enhance the learning experience for students via live seminars with leaders in the field.
- Increase Dental Application Fee from $\$ 50.00$ to $\$ 75.00$. Expenses related to receiving and processing Dental School student applications.
- New Fee - UNLVSOM Lab Support Fee: This $\$ 2,000.00$ annual fee is needed for the leasing and technology support expenses for student tables, virtual anatomy, small group rooms, technological components and learning commons' resources.
- New Fee - UNLVSOM Student Research Project Fee: This $\$ 500.00$ annual fee is needed for the required research experience that is part of the curriculum.
- New Fee - UNLVSOM NBME Exam Fee: This $\$ 640.00$ fee covers the expense for the National Board of Medical Examiners (NBME) Customized Assessment Service's exams needed for the student's summative assessment.
- New Fee - UNLVSOM USMLE Board Exam Preparation Fee: This $\$ 468.00$ fee is needed for the students' subscription to the U.S. Medical Licensing Examination (USMLE) Board preparation materials for the Step 1 and Step 2 Clinical Knowledge (CK) \& Clinical Skills (CS) licensing exams.
- New Fee - UNLVSOM Simulation Lab Fee: This $\$ 1,500.00$ annual fee for three years is needed to cover the costs for UNLV's Simulation Center and resources to learn and practice clinical skills, simulations, surgical lab fees, as well as expenses associated with standardized patient interactions.
- New Fee - UNLVSOM Medical School Student Administrative Fee: This $\$ 950.00$ annual fee covers a comprehensive wellness program which includes music, dance, art, massage and social events as well as instruction in techniques that have been demonstrated to reduce physician burnout and stress.


## UNR

- Approval to make the $\$ 50.00$ Counseling Services fee mandatory for University of Nevada, Reno School of Medicine students located in Reno.
- New Fee - Wellness Programming: This $\$ 25.00$ annual fee will allow the University of Nevada, Reno School of Medicine to offer wellness programs for medical students as mandated by the LCME accrediting agency.
- No Fee Change - Change in institution name to University of Nevada, Reno School of Medicine: Student Administrative Fee, National BME Subject Exam Fee (Year 1), Visiting Student Elective Fee, Simulation Lab Fee (per year), Anatomy Lab Fee, Year 1 and Multidisciplinary Lab Fee, Year 2.
- Increase Technology Fee - Regular from $\$ 4.00 /$ credit to $\$ 6.00 /$ credit. The fee has not changed since it was implemented in Fall 2000.

CSN

- Increase Application Fee from $\$ 10$ to $\$ 20$. The fee increase will align with the increasing cost of resources necessary to process applications.
- New Fee - New Student: This $\$ 20.00$ fee will cover the cost of mandatory placement testing in Math, Reading and English.
- Increase Special Examination Fee (Pass-Through) from $\$ 25-\$ 300$ to $\$ 25-\$ 350$. The fee increase will accommodate the pass-through exam fee for one-semester Medic to LPN track (test cost is \$350).
- Increase Technology Fee - Regular from \$4.00/credit to \$5.00/credit. Approval of this increase will align with the increasing cost and need for software applications and hardware to support student experience and delivery.


## TMCC

- Increase International Student Fee from \$50 to \$120 per semester. The fee has not changed in over a decade despite rising expenses associated with international students.
- New Fee - Student Association Fee/Undergraduate: This \$1.00/credit fee will provide the resources to fund activities, events, promotions and clubs.
- Increase Technology Fee - Regular from \$4.00/credit to \$5.00/credit. Demands for technology resources have increased dramatically in the past decade, while the Tech Fee has remained unchanged.


## WNC

- Increase Technology Fee - Regular from $\$ 4.00 /$ credit to $\$ 5.00 /$ credit. This fee has not been adjusted since it was adopted over 10 years ago.


## EXECUTIVE SUMMARY OF SPECIAL COURSE FEES

## Special Course Fees

It is the policy of the Board of Regents that the registration fee be the only fee assessed for taking a course except as outlined in this section. The reasons for these exceptions are extraordinary instruction costs due to: (a) individual instruction (e.g., private music lessons), (b) class supplies, course-specific software, and specialized equipment (e.g., welding equipment and materials), (c) third party charges for use of a facility (e.g., golf), (d) special transportation requirements, or (e) extraordinary instructional costs (e.g., intensive supervision, support or additional technical expertise required for the delivery of the course), (f) some combination of these reasons. Responsibility for implementing this policy is delegated to the presidents up to a maximum of $\$ 50.00$ per course. Courses requiring fees higher than $\$ 50.00$ require Board of Regents approval and are as follows (institutions may charge up to the amount approved):

## B. INTERNATIONAL STUDENT FEE

The recruitment, admission and advising of international students represents a tremendous cost to the University of Nevada, Reno, and University of Nevada, Las Vegas. The logistical and administrative burdens of international students on the university are complex and expensive. Increased costs of international mailing, phone, facsimile, recruitment, specialized printing, translations and highly trained personnel forces the university to make difficult budgetary choices. These choices often leave international students short of receiving the proper levels of attention.

Because of the limited resources of the Admissions and International Student Office, the need for funding aimed directly at the international students is essential. These funds will be directly used to support programs pertaining to international students. Additionally, it is not proper to use funds dedicated to benefit university student as a whole, to support activities that benefit only international students.

International students will pay a semester International Student Fee. The revenue from this fee will be used to sustain enrollment functions in the Admissions, Graduate, and International Student offices, supporting only international students.

## Section 12. Special Course Fees


#### Abstract

It is the policy of the Board of Regents that the registration fee be the only fee assessed for taking a course except as outlined in this section. The reasons for these exceptions are extraordinary instruction costs due to: (a) individual instruction (e.g., private music lessons), (b) class supplies, course-specific software, and specialized equipment (e.g., welding equipment and materials), (c) third party charges for use of a facility (e.g., golf), (d) special transportation requirements, or (e) extraordinary instructional costs (e.g., intensive supervision, support or additional technical expertise required for the delivery of the course), (f) some combination of these reasons. Responsibility for implementing this policy is delegated to the presidents up to a maximum of $\$ 50.00$ per course.
