SUBJECT: NSHE Crime Statistics Report Calendar Year 2015

Pursuant to the Jeanne Clery Crime Statistics Act (20 USC 1092), as part of the Higher Education Act of 1965, the NSHE institutions must disclose certain timely and annual information about campus crime. The report contains three years worth of campus crime statistics that have occurred on each NSHE campus.

The calendar year 2015 statistics are considered preliminary by the campuses. The statistics become final when the schools report statistics to the United States Department of Education in October 2016.

Significant Differences Year to Year

UNR

- Total combined drug and liquor law violation arrests increased slightly by approximately 3.3% from 214 in 2014 to 221 in 2015.
- Burglary and motor vehicle theft criminal offenses increased from 4 incidents in 2014 to 19 incidents in 2015.
- Forcible sex offenses decreased from 6 in 2014 to 1 in 2015.
- Liquor law violation disciplinary actions decreased approximately 36% from 320 in 2014 to 115 in 2015.

UNLV

- Total combined burglary and motor vehicle thefts decreased slightly in 2015 over 2014.
- Drug law violation arrests decreased by 41% from 27 incidents in 2014 to 11 in 2015.
- Total combined drug and liquor law violation disciplinary actions decreased 20% from 30 in 2014 to 24 in 2015.

TMCC

• There were 3 illegal weapon possession arrests in 2015 compared to no arrests in 2013 and 2015.

CSN

- Total combined burglary and motor vehicle thefts decreased by approximately 67% from 15 incidents in 2014 to 5 incidents in 2015.
- Total combined drug and liquor law violation arrests decreased 40% from 25 in 2014 to 15 in 2015.
