
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STATE APPROPRIATIONS

2009-2019





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
Budget Efficiencies

- Increased police presence





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Dual enrollment TMCC initiatives


- Course offerings at 7 area

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
Number of Graduates

TMCC 3-year Graduation Rate by Cohort of First-time, Full-time, Degree-seeking Students





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

- TMCC ranks 85th percentile on CCSSE Student Effort Benchmark Means






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Student Feedback
