






NUMBER OF GRADUATES







DEFERRED MAINTENANCE

Reduced deferred maintenance \$90.6M during FY 2012-2016

- FY 2014 estimated deferred maintenance needs total \$621M
- FY 2012-2015 spent \$20.1M (including \$8.1M of HECC/SHECC funds)
- FY 2015-2016 reduced deferred maintenance by \$53M
 - Eliminated \$49M with Getchell Library
 - Eliminated \$4M with White Pine Hall
- FY 2016
 - Approximately \$8.7M expenditures for infrastructure including roofs, lighting and mechanical systems and controls
 - \$8.8M Lincoln Hall Renovation


